

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rex Haberman, please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, as you remember the other day, I read to the body a statement and a resolution from the Foundation that they would provide the appropriate funds for utilities, janitorial services and such other costs that may be properly identified with the operation of the Lied Center and they went on to say how they were going to raise this money and if they did come up short in one method, that they will use the unrestricted funds currently held by the Foundation. So to make this official and to get it into the record this resolution merely says that the Legislature voices its support of the campaign to raise 5 million permanent endowment fund to operate and maintain the Lied Center. The purpose of the resolution is to say what they will do and to put it in concrete and put it in the record. That's the object of the resolution. I would ask for your support.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. Senator Beutler is absent for a little while, while he makes a speech or something and he has asked that we pass over this until he returns which we will do. We'll go on to LR 9,

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 9 was a resolution offered by Senator DeCamp. It is found on page 94 of the Legislative Journal. The resolution was considered on October 31 and again on November 4. There is an amendment pending by Senators Beutler, Schmit, Vickers and Rogers to the resolution.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, did you wish to take that amendment or Senator Schmit? What page did you say that was?

CLERK: The amendment, Senator, is on 101.
