

Senator Hoagland is on a roll with me this morning. What Senator Haberman said is very correct. I have taken the numbers and turned them in. But I think also, and I have reviewed a lot of the trip reports that have been made by certain agencies. They are available over at the Transportation Bureau. But I think that this resolution should be passed and sent on just as a reminder, and also to the fact that these agency heads just basically they sign those trip reports without ever checking them. I found mileage discrepancies, you see the gas tickets that come in. If the agency head would check these trip reports they could very well see where these people are purchasing their gas and find out that it is costing us a lot more. So I think that it would be good to pass a resolution just as a reminder to them because it is quite costly to the state. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. President, I rise to oppose Senator Hoagland's resolution. I feel that he is very incorrect on the terminology that it is going to save the state money, in actual, practical experience it is probably going to cost the state money. Being experienced in the service station business I've seen countless numbers of state employees pump their own gasoline. Traditionally the ones that do not pump their gasoline are the ones that don't know the basic, fundamental cares about cars. They don't know how to check the oil and they feel responsible for the state property and they want somebody to overlook it so it does not cause irreparable damage in the future. I think this is a resolution that should be defeated very strongly.
