

SENATOR HOAGLAND: We're about to go on Final Reading, aren't we? Is that next on the agenda, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: I believe so.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: All right. I'd ask for a call of the house and to accept call in votes so we can clear this up.

PRESIDENT: Call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: By that vote the house is under call. All members of the Legislature, please come to the Legislative Chamber and take your seat. You are properly to be in your seats during the time the house is under call. Senator Beutler, please, and Senator Chambers. Senator Chizek. Record your presence, please, on the call of the house. Senator Wesely, Senator Smith, Senators Hannibal, Lynch and Vard Johnson. Senator Sieck, Senator Eret, Senator Hartnett, please. Senator Hartnett, record your presence. Senator Goodrich. Call ins may be given to the Clerk on the...motion before the house is the adoption of resolution 26 and you may call in your vote to the Clerk. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Why don't we have a roll call vote, Mr. President, so we can get on to other issues today that are more important.

PRESIDENT: Roll call vote has been requested. May we have order in the Chamber. All members are to be in your seats. The house is under call. Proceed with the roll call vote on the adoption of resolution 26, vote aye or nay.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 236-37 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 10 nays on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. The call of the house is raised. However, we do proceed into Final Reading. Members are to be in your seats during the time of Final
