

Reading. Do we have a special motion before the house by Senator Nichol?

CLERK: Mr. President, the Speaker would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 7 (b) to permit consideration of bills on Final Reading today.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is simply so that we can do it within our rules and do it a day sooner. I move for the adoption of the resolution...I move for the suspension.

PRESIDENT: Motion for suspension of the rules. Motion is to suspend the rules to accomplish the purpose explained. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Motion is to suspend the rules. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the motion.

PRESIDENT: Motion to suspend the rules carries. We proceed with Final Reading on LB 3E.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on LB 3E. The first motion I have is by Senator John DeCamp. Senator DeCamp would move to return LB 3 to Select File for specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, so everybody knows I have no intention of hindering the bill, I want to get a vote on it just like you. I hope the vote defeats it. However, I would like to offer something other than the emotional arguments and the discussion of the evils of cigarettes and all these things, just a very practical argument for some of you to consider before you make your final vote.
