SENATOR HABERMAN: That is correct.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, thank you, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question.

PRESIDENT: There are no other lights, so maybe we don't need your question anyway. Thank you anyway. Senator Haberman, do you wish to close?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, I would urge you to return this bill to Select File. When you return the bill to Select File everything will stay in place the way it is now. The \$3.00 will not be taken off and the money will still go to drivers education. So what we will have effectively done is we will have time, between now and January, to chew on this and to find out what is right and what is wrong. I feel there are some feelings on this floor that the \$3.00 should be taken off. But we can't do that now and still adjourn Friday. But if we bring the bill back it will hold it in place for one more year the way it is. At least the money will go to the schools for drivers education. However, if you don't bring the bill back and if you pass the bill, they lose the money and the citizens don't get their \$3.00 back. So if you don't want to bring the bill back, then the next thing that you can do is vote no on the passage of the bill because that, again, will hold it into place and leave it just as it is, with the money going to the schools. Then in January we can decide again what is the best thing to do. So you are going to have two opportunities to be up front about this and be honest. The first one is bring it back, and effectively that will leave it the way it is, the second opportunity will be on Final Reading to vote no. That will leave it where it is, and then in January we can again try to take that \$3.00 off and give it back to the citizens. So if you vote to bring it back, or if you vote no on the bill, I think you are doing the right thing because that is just not fair and honest and sincere to pass LB 5. Then we would have to come back and undo what we have done. So let's just don't do it in the first place. We'll look like fools if we come back and try to undo what we did when we knew it was wrong when we were
