I ask you to vote no and not have the bill pass. I withdraw my motion. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, anything else?

CLERK: No, sir, nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Members, please take your seats. We are on Final Reading. I'll ask the Sergeants-at-Arms to gently remind you to keep your seats and blame it on the Chair, that is the rule. Okay, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 5 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 5 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote as you wish to vote on LB 5. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 242 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 18 nays, 1 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 5 is declared passed. LB 10 with the emergency clause.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first motion I have on ten is a unanimous consent request to bracket the bill until later in the day.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner has made the request to bracket the bill until later in the day. Is there objection? Hearing an objection, I guess maybe...Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman, you are not in your seat. We are on Final Reading. Do you wish to make a motion, Senator Warner? Yes, Senator Haberman is in his seat and he's objecting.
