

SENATOR WARNER: I move it be bracketed.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to bracket the bill until later in the day. Then I guess this is a debatable motion. Senator Abboud, do you wish to speak? Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: I just need some information. We have two bills. As I understand they are identical, LB 10 and 35. Is that correct?

PRESIDENT: Maybe that is a substantive matter that should be answered by somebody on the floor.

SENATOR DECAMP: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: The two bills are identical.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. Do you want to go ahead and read 35, or deal with it now?

SENATOR WARNER: I would be in favor of taking up the order, the Speaker's agenda.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. All I'm trying to find out is what the game plan is, in other words are we going to deal with the income tax in LB 35, or LB 10, or is there any...

SENATOR WARNER: If LB 10 is bracketed, LB 35 will be taken up first.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to bracket LB...

SENATOR DECAMP: I think he wants to withdraw his objection.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: Motion is to...you are withdrawing your objection? Very well. Is there further objection to bracketing the bill? Hearing none, it is so ordered. It is bracketed until later in the day. Senator Hannibal, are you rising for a purpose? Okay. All right, Mr. Clerk,
