

SENATOR WARNER: I would concur with Senator Johnson. If we're going to take up that bill, obviously the fate of LB 35 would have some effect upon our recommendations.

PRESIDENT: Very well. If it's agreeable with the Speaker then, we will proceed to LB 35 and skip the recess for the Appropriations Committee at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, it is my understanding that if the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee wishes to have one, he may have a time...some time at this time to have a meeting with his committee. Should he not choose to do so, of course, he doesn't have to have it and we can continue on. So, if Senator Warner does not wish to have a meeting at this time, we can continue on with the business at hand.

PRESIDENT: And we have a motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to reconsider the final passage of LB 35 with the emergency clause attached.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers. May we have order? (Gavel). Order in the Legislative Chamber. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, may I have a call of the house, please?

PRESIDENT: A call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The house is under call. All members, please record your presence on the board in front. Record your green light. The house is under call. All members of the Legislature throughout the Capitol Building are advised to return to the Legislative Chamber. The house is under call. Members are properly to be in your seats during the time the house is under call and we are, in effect, still on Final Reading.
