PRESIDENT: Members throughout the Capitol Building, please be notified that the house is under call. We ask you to return to the Legislature and record your presence. Senators Rod Johnson and Sieck, Senator Don Eret, Carol Pirsch, Arlene Nelson. Members have been asked to come to the floor who are absent. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, several people have inquired. There is being run a five or six sheet showing each agency, what the reduction in that agency's budget in LB 1 and then the amount of reduction by virtue of the Governor's veto and it should be on your desk in a few minutes. They are being run now, but it will be very easy to identify how much reduction in each agency would occur if the veto is sustained or how much would be reduced as LB 1 was passed.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator. Members, please record your presence. Senator Nelson, would you please check in. Thank you. All right, everyone is here who is not excused. There is Senator Sieck. Now we'll proceed. The motion is to reconsider and offered by Senator Chambers. Senator.
