You said you're paying taxes on your income this year, but sorry, old buddy out there that is paying the taxes, we're raising it retroactively. It is one thing to raise the taxes for the future, but I think it is immoral and the wrong thing to do to raise taxes retroactively and I hope we learn from this lesson again and again and again that we should have learned before now, to be more careful and to do it in a more businesslike way than this. If you were an employee and your employer said I'm going to raise your wages and a week later he comes back and says, I'm having a little trouble, I'm going to reduce your wages. You'd stand still. Another week goes by and he says I'm going to raise them half as much as it was and a week later he comes back and says we're going to take more away from you. You'd think, what the heck kind of an employer do I have? So I just hope from all of this that we carefully plan in the future. Thank you.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. There was one thing that I failed to mention in some of my reasons why I did vote to repeal the homestead exemption that was the general homestead exemption for everyone which was probably a \$75 savings for the year. So along with the reevaluation in my county and the increased income tax, the increase in the cigarette tax, that is one of the great reasons why I have been voting as I have. I now would like to withdraw my motion. Thank you.
