

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on page 256 of the Legislative Journal.) 37 ayes, 9 nays on the motion that LB 1 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Governor's veto is overridden and LB 1 is passed with the emergency clause. The Clerk has matters to read into the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk did present to the Governor, as of 3:34 p.m. LB 35.

Mr. President, communication from the Governor to the Clerk. (Read communication regarding LB 35 found on page 258 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have ready for your signature a certificate attesting to the passage of LB 1.

PRESIDENT: LB 1, having been returned by the Governor with his signature but with certain items therein line-item vetoed, the Legislature by the constitutional majority has overridden all line-item vetoes. These provisions have become law, therefore, the 15th day of November, 1985. I propose to sign this certificate now while the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business. Senator Sieck, you have a motion to make?

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President, I move that a committee of five be appointed to wait upon the Governor to advise him that the Legislature has completed its work and is ready to adjourn, and to ask him if he has any further message for the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion of Senator Sieck to appoint a committee to have the Governor escorted to the Chamber. All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The Chair appoints the following committee to escort the Governor to the Chamber: Senator Chambers, Senator Carsten, Senator Landis, Senator Hall and Senator Rupp. Is Senator Chambers available to be an escort officer? Would you call Senator Chambers and see if he could...ask him to be on the escort committee. Is Senator Landis here also? Please, Senator Landis, would you go over and get the Governor. Ask Senator Chambers, see if we can find him. We are trying to locate
