irritation. But more significantly, and secondly, I think that this mood tends to spread outside of this Chamber and outside of this building. It tends to be shared by the people themselves. I believe that we must guard against this spreading frustration because our job is not only to identify problems and try to offer up solutions for those problems, not only to discuss and to pass legislation, but our job is also to declare with confidence and hope that Nebraska's future will be brighter. Today our task, and it's a difficult task, is to heal the wounds which have been inflicted this past month and then to get onto the business of building better schools, the business of helping our industries grow, the business of protecting our natural resources. Today our task is also to remind Nebraskans that we are a community of people and that we must respond to the problems which face us accordingly. We must not turn our backs upon those who are suffering in our state, the rural and the urban poor, the farmers and ranchers who are facing severe financial crisis, the elderly, the handicapped and all those who are less fortunate than we are. We must face the future with faith and with hope. We must be proud about our strengths and we must build upon them. We must also face it with love, love of friends and neighbors who will need our hope and our help more than ever before. Nebraska is a rich and is a fortunate state. We must help our citizens as they work to build a better tomorrow. Thank you.
