

November 12, 1986. The bill was referred directly to General File by the Reference Committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move for the advancement of LB 2E. As has been explained by the Clerk, it is the expenses for this special session. I can break it down for you, that was prepared by the Clerk and the Revisor of Statutes plus the Fiscal Office Analyst, if you would like. The Senators per diem is \$17,763, and from the Clerk's Office, the phones for the Chamber, the "rehookup" for those was \$4,400; \$5,500 for stamping; \$8,000 for printing and processing; \$17,900 total. And then for the Revisor, the printing and the data processing is \$2,000, making a total of \$37,663 for the session. I would move for the advancement of the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? The motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor will vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk. Senator Pappas, did you rise on this bill.

SENATOR PAPPAS: No, a point of personal privilege.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Just a moment please and I will recognize you.

CLERK: Mr. President, 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance LB 2.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Senator Pappas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR PAPPAS: A point of personal privilege.

SPEAKER NICHOL: State your point, please.

SENATOR PAPPAS: There comes a time that some people are too humble to really say what they would like to and show what they accomplished in life. This morning I would like to point out that there is one member among us that is in possession of a brand new pair of shoes that he has shown several people and, Senator Hefner, my humble colleague from Coleridge, if you would like, people can come look at his new pair of shoes which he has been showing people this morning. They are a nice looking pair of shoes and I hope everybody has a chance to look at Senator Hefner's shoes.
