

puts the system into effect and that is the reason for the special session basically because it has to be done before December 24. I would urge you to advance the bill. I am sure there will be some more amendments that I will be offering on Select File. I would like to go over with all parties that might be affected...the effect of these amendments before I would offer them. And I would even suggest if somebody might consider holding off on some other amendments until you have had a chance to review them with everybody because sometimes on this type of bill, as you well know, you who have been around, the amendment that looks so simple and clear and that it would do this or that solution may already be taken care in the bill or in the alternative there may be fundamental reasons why something shouldn't be done even though it looks clear to you that it should be.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Before we take up any other amendments, Senator Sieck, did you wish to speak to the bill itself?

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President, members of the body, I am going to support the bill even though I did not support 603. The basic reason I am supporting it is because of the federal mandate of prenotification and the real difficulty that many of our borrowers are having in getting money because of this, and the difficulty of paperwork which is caused by this bill to the bankers, and I feel that there is no other alternative but to support the bill. But I have some reservations. There are a lot of people out there, a lot of farmers, that don't get newspapers, don't listen to the radio much, are not aware of this. They are not aware of central filing, and they will not be, and they will be caught, and that really bothers me, and I don't think it is right because we are so used to paying our bills. We don't think anything about asking whether you have got a lien on it or not. I do it. We have got a lot of trust and that is what most farmers are, and they are going to get caught, and I feel that there has to be an educational program, and who is to do it? The bankers of our state can do it. They can let their depositors know what this is and it is very important. I don't want to put it in law. I don't think that is proper but I do want them to know that that is very important. I don't think they like double jeopardy as well as I do. They hate to do it but do they realize that there are a lot of people out there that don't know it. I know that these suppliers, the elevators, the grain dealers, they have accepted this. They don't like it but they have accepted it. They would
