

SENATOR HOAGLAND: And it works one way for existing loans (interruption).

SENATOR DECAMP: Senator Rod Johnson, you may answer if you would.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: And it would work a different way for future loans.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Rod Johnson, would you respond?

SENATOR DECAMP: The doomed farmer that Senator Chambers is trying to save, the one that is already out there, already got the loan, already got the homestead, do you claim that this is going to apply retroactively to him?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I am sorry, John, I (interruption).

SENATOR DECAMP: As I say, do you claim that this applies retroactively to that "doomed farmer" that Senator Chambers is talking about to keep his home and all that?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: The bill or the law as it is or this bill?

SENATOR DECAMP: This bill.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: I think it does.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. I would submit to you that they are full beans and that history will show that either I am or they are. You can't take this whole system and revert it backwards. You can't create homesteads and all kinds of things where they weren't before. You can't change basic contract rights. They know it. They have to know it. Now, that is part number one. Part number two, with respect to whether I was telling you accurately the way the bill will work, I did not accuse anybody in here of lying to the Legislature. I said one thing lobbyists all have to learn, that is if they lie to the Legislature they have hell to pay in the future. I went back and I talked to Mark Hunzeker since he seems to be the principal involved in this. I said, Mark, tell me anywhere I said anything wrong. His answer, go back and check, absolutely everything you said was right and I told the task force this, and I told them it
