

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence and those not in the Chamber please return to the Chamber and record your presence so that we may move on. If you are in the Chamber, please return to your desk so that we can move on. Looking for Senator Labedz, Senator Haberman, Senator Goodrich, Senator Hall, Senator Conway, Senator Hartnett, Senator Schmit. We are looking for Senator Hall and Senator Schmit. Senator Harris, will you record your presence, please. Thank you. Pardon me, sir, what did you say? Okay, we are going to have a roll call vote on the adoption of the Chambers amendment. Would you please return to your desks and remain quiet so the Clerk can hear your response. Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 80 and 81 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Do you have anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have on the bill is that offered by Senator Vickers. (See Vickers amendment on pages 96-7 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the amendment that I would offer is before you on your desk.

SENATOR VICKERS: I want to tell you, the way that LB 3 is structured right now if Dad has moved off of the farm, moved to town, his son is living on the farm, Dad is the owner of the mortgage, if you will, he is the one that is being foreclosed on, because Dad doesn't live on the farm, they can't redeem the homestead. That is the way LB 3 is drafted, as I read it right now. The amendment that I have would change that so that if there is a relation out there on the farm, they could redeem the
