well at the property tax levy in the state and we look as well at the lack of equalization aid that goes out or the insufficient equalization aid that goes out to our schools and that problem isn't going to go away and our people are going to want it addressed. I would suggest as well that the legislators, that you consider the lack of authority that we have as we address primary and secondary education, and one of the observations that I would make that would improve both our control, both our authority and the extent to which we can be held responsible would be to make the Department of Education a code agency and give the Governor the responsibility and the authority that I think the Governor needs in order to improve our educational system. In the area of higher education, again, we are going to have continued problems with higher education as we try to address which one of the good programs we can't afford to be, which one of the good programs we're going to select out, and I would suggest respectfully to the body that the State of Nebraska needs to increase citizen program review. We're one of the few states that have very weak program review in higher education and we need it. We need to have citizen involvement in reviewing all of the programs of higher education to a much greater extent than we currently have. I suggest as well, as we talk about the need to have higher education impact economic development, that it would be wise for the people to say that we should permit the Governor of the State of Nebraska to appoint the Board of Regents so as to be able to exert some indirect influence over that organization. In the area of economic development we're going to hear increased cries of the people to say that we need to improve the economic climate, we need to create new jobs and I would point out to you that much needs to be done there in addition to expending additional dollars. As I stand and look at the Department of Economic Development it is interesting to me to note that department has very little authority. It does not have the power that I think that it needs if it is going to be able to accomplish the things that the people want. It is interesting to note that the Department of Economic Development, if it is approached by people from Omaha or people from Lincoln to try to do something in those two communities, that it has very little that it can do because of the block grants and the job training money flowed directly to those two communities and we have very little influence over how they are used. I would suggest again that rather than just looking at the issue of money, that you look at the issue of authority and responsibility and consider and reorganizing that department so as to give it the authority and the responsibility that it needs over some taxation, over some regulation, over
