

CLERK: 42 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 1.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted and I'll sign it. We'll take it with us this afternoon, Senator Cal Carsten. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 1. The plan is that we will meet at nine-thirty tomorrow morning, nine-thirty. So, it might be a little bit different than we have been in the past, but plan on nine-thirty. I understand some hearings are happening today, of course, which you will want to pay attention to and you've heard Senator Cal Carsten say that there is a van taking those who wish to ride to the funeral at approximately eleven-thirty this morning. Of course, the van will be at the west side of the Capitol at the Abe Lincoln statue. Mr. Clerk, do you have some things to put in?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lynch...

CLERK: I do have a motion from Senator Lynch, Mr. President. Senator Lynch would move that the special session of the Legislature adjourn sine die.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Speaker, it is my understanding it is not a debatable item?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, that is correct.

SENATOR LYNCH: Unless it is inappropriate, I will address the reasons why, but I don't think it is at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Pardon me, what did you say?

SENATOR LYNCH: I didn't think it was appropriate for me to address or debate the issue at this time just to present the motion which I did.

SPEAKER NICHOL: That's right, you have the motion in front of us, not debatable, and you can vote on adjourning sine die at this time. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 4 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn
