

There are a considerable number of cash funds left over. I know that in many instances some of those cash funds will be or will or have been, in fact, obligated, but, in fact, you have \$18,300,000 of unobligated cash funds. Have we researched diligently to determine whether out of this total of about 36...\$34 million there might, in fact, be cuts of \$6.5 million that are more meritorious than those cuts which we have accepted with the Appropriations Committee budget. It is a new and unique approach, I can see, but one which I think deserves some attention and one which after a number of years in this body I think we have had a tendency to pass over each budgetary year, so that I would just ask you to read those numbers and I really don't know because I have not had the opportunity. It took us the whole weekend to develop this, but I have not had the chance to call these people in and say, you know, do you really need, for example, the Enforcement of Standards of Motor Vehicles, \$543,000 will be left over if they continue to spend money at the same rate. Does that, in fact, then transfer into a surplus? We have over here...in 1985 we lapsed a considerable amount of money into the General Fund, I think \$4.7 million in the fiscal year '84-85-86. Is there, in fact, a little bit of a chance that out of that 546,000 we might possibly pick up 66,000 that could justify keeping the advocacy agencies intact and not really seriously jeopardize the Department of Motor Vehicles? If they need it, that's fine. But I think they ought to have the opportunity to come before the Appropriations Committee and say, yes, we do need it. And I recognize, I have never served on the Appropriations Committee, I never had that opportunity to enter that area and I may be totally off base, but it would appear to me that there are some questions here that might be raised and ought to be answered.
