

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate ceases. Senator Chambers, would you like to close, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this has been a good and productive discussion.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me. I'm sorry, it is Senator Warner's amendment. I'm sorry, Senator Chambers. Please accept my apology. Senator Warner.

In simple terms, if you wish to have the Scottsbluff nursing program continued, vote yes on the amendment. If you wish to have it discontinued, vote no, and vote for the good of the order.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Point of order. May I beg your indulgence to restate what we're vote...the way we're voting, to tell what it was that I was doing.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, so what Senator Chambers, what Senator Warner was saying was that if you want to keep the nursing home (sic) at Scottsbluff, vote green. If you want to do away with it, vote no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's not a nursing home even.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, it's not a nursing home even.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Whatever it is. If you are in favor of keeping a program, vote green. If you vote no, we do away with it, whatever it is. Senator Warner, please.
