

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman, a point of order. I have a priority motion before you to adjourn sine die.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. You've heard the motion. It is not debatable. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The motion is to adjourn sine die. A simple majority rules. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I'd ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 1 nay to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. There are four excused. We're looking for Senator McFarland, Senator Abboud, Senator Labeledz, please record your presence. Senator Bernice Labeledz, please record your presence. Thank you. Senator Lundy. Senator McFarland is on his way. Okay, we're going to have...the question is to adjourn sine die. We've had a request for a reverse order, roll call vote and Senator McFarland is here which is all present except those excused and the motion is to adjourn sine die. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 23 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President, to adjourn sine die.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. We're back on the Landis...no, we're back on the DeCamp amendment to the amendment. The call is raised, and I have four speakers in order that we're back on the motion itself starting with Senator Chambers. Did you wish to speak on the amendment to the amendment? Okay.
