

SENATOR LANDIS: I'd be happy... Since Senator Schmit is a co-sponsor of the amendment, if that is the only light, perhaps he would like to close.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No, there are others, there are others.

SENATOR LANDIS: Oh, no, there can't be this late in the day.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Oh, yes, there are.

SENATOR LANDIS: Are there?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I will be very, very brief. Senator DeCamp did hurl a challenge and it was rejected in the way that it should be. The thing to do now is to put these commissions on an equitable basis, and a step in that direction is the adoption of Senator Landis's amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator McFarland, please.

SENATOR McFARLAND: Mr. Speaker, I move that we adjourn until tomorrow morning at 9:00 a.m.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. May the Clerk read something in before we vote on your motion?

CLERK: Excuse me, Senator. Just for the record, the Revenue Committee will be conducting a public hearing tomorrow at nine o'clock on LB 4. Revenue, nine o'clock, tomorrow morning, LB 4. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is to adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We will go to a board vote on it. Simple majority rules. Have you all voted that care to? Senator McFarland.

SENATOR McFARLAND: Never mind, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, you are the next speaker, please. Oh, record. Excuse me, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn.
