

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Education, whose Chair is Senator Vickers, reports LB 2 to General File with committee amendments attached. And I also have amendments from Senator Hall to be printed to LB 1, Mr. President. That is all that I have. (See pages 25-30 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion is to adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting to adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock. It takes 25. Senator Morehead, did you wish to say something? Your light is on. Okay. It takes a simple majority. Record, Mr. Clerk. Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Please look up to see if your light is lit. I can see many of you here who have not pushed your little green button, like Senator Labeledz, Senator Haberman, Senator Landis, Senator DeCamp, Senator Sieck, Senator Hefner, Senator Warner, Senator Peterson, Senator Chambers. The question is, shall we adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning? Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 30-31 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, to adjourn.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Senator Morehead to speak about the Haberman amendment.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, I would like to call the question on the Haberman amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays to cease debate, Mr. President,

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. Senator Haberman, please.
