CLERK: Senator, I'm not sure...

SENATOR VICKERS: Let me just explain it, Mr. President.

SENATOR VICKERS: The committee...the amendment that I offer is by the Bill Drafter. There were some bill drafting oversights as it was drafted the other day. As you might know, they drafted it very quickly thinking that we might want to take LB 2 up ahead of LB 1. So, there was a lot of frantic work being done by the bill drafters. And I apologize for having to bring this to you. What it does is it makes some language changes. On page 1 of the committee amendment handicapped children, up on line 13 through 18, handicapped children, that language still includes the term "behavior impaired" and we need to strike that language and put in the "seriously emotionally disturbed" since that is the language we are changing down below. Also, we need to include in that language speech impaired children in that definition of handicapped children. The other changes are back in the sections dealing with the cap, and they are, quite frankly, more of a real technical nature, just making the language so it reads much more smoothly and clearly, and more easily understood. So, I would ask for the adoption of those amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Goodrich on the amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes. Can we depend on you distributing a copy of these somewhere, get a copy of them made and give it to those of us that want it?

SENATOR VICKERS: I just got them myself just a few minutes ago, Senator Goodrich. I will have them, but I don't know...

SENATOR GOODRICH: I have no problem with it, other than the fact that I want to be sure you will give us a copy of it as soon as you can get copies made.

SENATOR VICKERS: Sure.
