

behavior that was not considered appropriate, and they didn't develop those good interpersonal relationships because when they went to these white schools, Fontenelle was the elementary school, and they were called racial names, they were instructed by me to fight, and the teachers didn't like that. But I thought it was very appropriate under the circumstances, and my children taught a lot of little white children what their parents, the churches and schools couldn't, and by stopping the problem there it kept them from having more serious problems later on. And because these programs create problems in the black community, and in the community that deals with poor white children, attention and time should be given to it now that it is before us.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you. Senator Vickers, would you like to close on your amendment?

SENATOR VICKERS: I would just again, Mr. President, indicate that the amendments are really technical in nature, brought to me just recently by the Bill Drafters Office. And I apologize to the body for not having copies for you. But rather than take up time on Select File, I thought it would be better to do it now, if we could possibly do it. But we will have copies made and have them distributed to you, so you can see the language. But I would ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is the adoption of the Vickers amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Vickers amendment to the committee amendment. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The Vickers amendment has been adopted to the committee amendments. Do you have anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: What do you wish to do with the bill, Senator Vickers?

SENATOR VICKERS: I just ask for the advancement of LB 2 to E & R Initial.
