SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, thank you. The question is, shall the DeCamp amendment be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. We are voting on the DeCamp amendment to LB 1. Have you all voted that care to? Have you all voted? Senator DeCamp, do you want to do anything?

SENATOR DECAMP: I would like a record vote.

SENATOR CARSTEN: A record vote. Have you all voted?

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I will tell you what.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The house is under call. All senators please return to your seats and press your green button. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. We would ask those senators that can hear me to please return to the Chamber and register your presence. The house is under call. Senator Conway, oh, he's here. Senator Baack. There he is. Senator Harris, please. There he is. Senator Lynch, Senator Vickers. Senator Abboud. Senator Abboud is on his way. He will be here shortly. Senator DeCamp, do you want a roll call now?
