It does belong to the people, but it does not always serve the interests and needs of the people. Politics will always be in this Legislature because it's a political body and it's the political process that brings us here and people do listen to political voices, and the ones that speak the loudest and are the strongest are the ones that will have their will. I only make hats. I don't put names on them. If you walk in a hat store, you search around the hats until you find the one that fits and then you put it on until I whistle and shout like Santa Claus and call names. Then I'm just making generalizations. If I want to mention somebody by name as I did the Governor-elect and present Governor Kerrey and Rochford and Bare, I know the names of people and I know how to call them and that's exactly what I will do. This is a political issue...

SENATOR CARSTEN: Time.
