

SENATOR CARSTEN: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...may lead us, at least, to restore this \$2,000.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Chambers, you can if you prefer and would like to make your closing on your motion now, also. That is your opening and closing. The question then is, shall this Chambers amendment be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 58 of the Legislative Journal.) 8 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the motion.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Chambers. (See Chambers amendment (10) on page 47 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is the last one. Senator Warner, this amendment deals with Environmental Control. What will be affected by this cut?

SENATOR WARNER: What they indicated they would be doing, Senator Chambers, is be reducing some computer modeling which had been relative to legislation enacted, I guess, last session on groundwater contamination, and it would be annualized probably, and next year they had anticipated six special...special protection area studies. They would probably do five special protection areas and that relates to the same broad...for thing of hazardous waste control in groundwater.
