I will be back, not as a senator, but I will be representing myself as a citizen of the State of Nebraska for this cause because I believe very strongly in it. The need is there and we have done so much and there is so much to do that I just feel that we have to continue on. I know that it was increased considerable through a period of years and that was because of the replacement of people out of the Beatrice institution and then we discovered that there were many citizens out here, and as I said earlier, we still haven't reached them all. They are still there, the one that I mentioned the other day is not a case that is in the waiting list, just a case that came out of the clear blue sky. I know of another one that is out there, and they are going to be because the parents are going to pass away, and what is going to happen to them? They are going to have to have some need, and these are the kind of things that we are looking at, and I want you to recognize it. So I am asking you to support the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is the adoption of the Sieck amendment. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Sieck, do you want to do anything different? A roll call vote has been requested. The Clerk will call the roll, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. (See pages 59-60 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The amendment is adopted. Have anything more, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do.
