

SENATOR CARSTEN: Debate has ceased. Senator Hartnett, would you like to close on your motion?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes, if I could just respond some. I think that we...I think we should take this authority to spend this money and I think it is not as restricted as Senator Wesely has said, because on the last page, according to DOE, there is quite a few areas that we can spend. There is money available to the public transportation, such as the MAT buses, and so forth, so I think the area is much broader than that. I think that is something we should exert that right to...even though the Governor has this Task Force and I have looked at spending, that we should spend this money the only way that we see it. So I will simply close with that.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, thank you. The question is, shall the Hartnett amendment be adopted? Is that correct? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Call of the house, please.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Shall the house go under call? That is the question. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk. The house is under call. All senators return to your chairs, record your presence. All unauthorized personnel will please leave the floor. Those senators who are not in the Chamber, but can hear my voice, please return and register your presence when you come in. Senator DeCamp, will you poke your...good. Senator Hoagland, Senator Baack, Senator Lamb. Senator McFarland, will you register your presence, please. Thank you. Senator Nelson, will you register your presence, please. Senator Scofield. Senator Scofield. Thank you. Senator Lamb and Senator Hoagland are the two we are waiting on. Senator Hartnett, did you ask for a roll call? Okay. Is that a request? Okay, we will go to a roll call vote and have had a request for reverse order. Please be quiet so the Clerk can hear the answers and you may proceed now with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call taken. See pages 66-67 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the motion.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion fails and the amendment is not adopted. Do you have anything more on the bill?
