CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Warner, what would you like to do with the bill now?

SENATOR WARNER: I would appreciate, Mr. President, very much to advance it to E & R Final.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The motion is to advance LB 1 to E & R Engrossment. All those in favor of that motion will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Pardon? That's true. Sorry about that. You are correct, Senator Chambers, and you may speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, unfortunately when I am correct I don't usually win, but I have only one comment to make about this whole process that we have gone through, but I want to introduce it with a comment I made the other day. It is a sham. It is a hoax. It's a lying session. And now to quote Malcolm X, you have been misled, you have been had, you have been took.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you. Senator DeCamp, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: Are there any other lights?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall the debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 10 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
