

Vickers' amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The Vickers amendments are adopted. Now, Senator Vickers. Do you have anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hartnett would move to amend. (The Hartnett amendment is found on page 69 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Hartnett, your amendment to LB 2.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I guess the purpose of my amendment is simply to get some comments on record from Senator Vickers related to this bill, and mine would really...in the Journal on page 29, would strike the bottom lines starting with 20, 21, through 24. I would simply like to ask...and then starting after that on page 30, lines 1 to 7, ending with subsection in line 7 and then starting on line 15 on page 30. I would simply like to maybe ask Senator Vickers some questions simply for the record and I will simply maybe withdraw the amendment, and I apologize to Senator Vickers because I was not here the other night when this bill was in the first round.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Vickers, will you respond to the questions, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Certainly, yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Tom, is it true that in 1986-87, Special Education Program, is a base year which will determine the 1987-88 reimbursement level?

SENATOR VICKERS: The 1986-87...

SENATOR HARTNETT: '86-87.

SENATOR VICKERS: ...programs, the programs right now in the schools...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes.

SENATOR VICKERS: ...are the ones that will determine, and then the funding for the '87-88, or, excuse me, '86-87 year from the Legislature...wait a minute, '87-88, yes...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Uh huh.
