

next year which should effectively destroy the next session in its ability to deal with the real problems of the state, such as economic development and the other things. But even more significant than that, you have left yourselves, the Legislature of this state and the state, without a system for setting tax rates at this time. Thank you. I withdraw it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Mr. Clerk, you have anything else to come before the body?

CLERK: Well, nothing at this time, Mr. President, until I receive the engrossed bills. Senator Pappas wants attention, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Ladies and gentlemen, we will be at ease until the bills comes back down, which will be 20 minutes, 30 minutes, something like that. So we will just be at ease for 20, 30 minutes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Surprise, what we are waiting for is here. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 1 and find the same correctly engrossed; and LB 2 correctly engrossed, both of those signed by Senator Hall as Enrollment and Review Chairperson. (See pages 70-71 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you have anything else to say to us?

CLERK: Not at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins, you haven't said much today, would you like to say something about adjourning until nine-thirty in the morning. Nine-thirty.
