The Governor then appointed two individuals, Betty Matz from Cozad and Dennis Carlson from Lincoln. We had a hearing yesterday on these appointments. There was no controversy involved and they came out of committee unanimously. I would move for their adoption.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the adoption of the report. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the confirmation report.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The confirmation report is adopted. Do you have anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President, at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Conway, would you have a few words for us about adjourning until nine o'clock tomorrow, please.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Speaker, I move to adjourn until nine o'clock tomorrow morning, Friday.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. We are adjourned until nine o'clock tomorrow morning. Thank you for your attention and attendance today.
