committee...the language, in Section 4 of that, mentioned that the Executive Board has to sign off that that is a committee...is an agency of importance or interest to the committee.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay. So, consequently, if I find the committee then that has something to do with, and, as you know, we have reference fights every day, so there could be two or three committees that could technically have a legitimate interest in that agency. Okay. So, consequently, what I'm basically saying the rules are, just to make sure I understand the rules now after we agree with this one, the rules are I find the committee that I have five people that will agree with me that has something...that has an interest in that agency, and I will get priority status over everyone else. Is that what the game is going to be after we agree with amendment three?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Moore, do you yield to...I assume that's the second question?

SENATOR MOORE: If the amendment is filed by the Standing Committee, within the time constraints listed in the rule, that would be the case. It would...it would not have priority over the Appropriations Committee budget recommendation, but it would have priority if filed, since the debate would not have started, would have priority over any individual senator's proposed amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: And my final question, if I still have time, Senator Moore, to you, if you would again yield to a further question, would be, do you, personally, as Chairman, feel real comfortable that a committee that has really taken hours, for example, Judiciary Committee, they'll go way into the night, all session long, maybe even have to meet especially after the committee time for meeting is over because they are so backlogged, they come up with an amendment on the appropriations budget without ever having to look at the amendment process, are you real comfortable as the Chairman of that committee saying, gee, guys, you're right, we spent hours doing this, you haven't had time to look at it, but, by golly, we're going to give you priority over everyone else? Do you feel comfortable with that?
