we created the policy to allow aid to those who have need, they will be given that aid despite any rule by the NCAA. I think it is fair, and I did hand out an editorial in the student paper which supports this bill. Those students over there understand the situation much better than Senator Hefner, much better than the World-Herald, because they see the problems that these students encounter when they are deprived of aid that they need based on their financial condition. So I am asking that you do continue to support the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Seeing no one wishing to debate the bill further, is there a closing? Closing is waived. We will proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 69. All those in favor...a machine vote has been requested. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 69.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted and LB 69 is advanced. LB 220.

CLERK: Senator Will, I have E & R amendments, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 220.

PRESIDENT MOUL: All those in favor of the motion to adopt the E & R amendments please say aye. Opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the advancement of LB 220 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Seeing no one wishing to debate this motion, all those in favor of the motion to advance LB 220 please say aye. Opposed nay. The motion is adopted and LB 220 is advanced. Mr. Clerk.
