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whether or not they are available for inspection by the body. I would like to ask that question of Senator Hefner.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Landis, I...we, in the minority...in this minority report, do not address those 95 votes.

SENATOR LANDIS: Right, and let me ask my question.

SENATOR HEFNER: We...

SENATOR LANDIS: The question is, do they exist and can they be counted? Do they exist and can they be counted?

SENATOR HEFNER: This doesn't say that in the minority report.

SENATOR LANDIS: My question is, do they exist and can they be counted? If you don't know, then the answer "I don't know" would be perfectly satisfactory to me. But the question is, do they exist and can they be counted?

SENATOR HEFNER: I can't answer that question.

SENATOR LANDIS: I don't know if...Senator Ashford, perhaps. The point here is apparently that the argument is that we should do the voter intent. We do not wish to take on the role apparently of simply ministerially following what the function of the law is but we want to give ourselves some discretion. If, in fact, we want to exercise discretion, and there are 95 votes that have some kind of procedural failure to them, a procedural failure that the minority report basically argues should not stand, a procedural report...a procedural issue which Senator Schmit would say is not to be laid at the feet of those voters and I suggest that we get the 95 votes, count them and make a decision. If the argument is in the minority report to carry the minority report to its logical conclusion, is to find votes which have not been counted because of some kind of failure by the election official, not by the voter, but the election official and count them to conclude what the voter intent of the 30th District is and that's what I suggest that we do. I suggest we take the spirit of the minority report and actually carry it out minus its politics and take that legal theory of voter intent to its absolute maximum. Let's get the votes. Let's count them just like we do on the opening day and
