SENATOR NELSON: I believe it has been well discussed. For my to say whether the bill should revert back to the original bill or back to the...remove the committee amendments, I have not been a member of the Natural Resources Committee, but I do understand that there is a problem and that we do have to take action. And with that, I think it is fully discussed, and if Senator Johnson or Senator Morrissey want any more of time, they can have it. Thank you. If not, that's it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Senator Nelson. I would just say we need to get back in focus on LB 67. I think Senator Nelson has allowed us the opportunity to do that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. We will now proceed to vote on the motion which is an amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the amendment to the amendment? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 9 nays on adoption of Senator Nelson's amendment to the committee amendments, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Nelson amendment to the committee amendments is passed.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Morrissey would move to amend the committee amendments. (See FA39 on page 818 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Madam President. My amendment, if you look at the committee amendments, I guess it is the second line 4 that is on the committee amendments down towards the bottom, after "land pollution", and I left my copy up there, we would simply add...all right, "The plan shall be approved by the department and shall address the threat of air, water, and land pollution, and shall contain a date for compliance or closure of such landfills." Some folks were concerned that we weren't giving them a date. My understanding of a closure or licensure plan would be that it would call for when it shall be closed or when it shall come...be licensed, or licensable. This will make it a little more clear. It will not make everyone in
