

for broker dealers go up, for investment advisors go up, the fees for securities agents goes up and basically the bill is a wash. It changes at the level of I believe \$10 million, our registration from one-tenth of 1 percent to one-twentieth. That puts us in line with what other states do and then to match that we have another addition of revenue based on the expansion of those fees. I would move for the advancement of the bill.
