We need to address our own problems, and by killing the bill, you, basically in effect, say we are not interested in dealing with our own garbage, so let's deal with the out-of-state garbage question, and I don't think that is relevant. I think we need to address both of them and this bill helps us address at least the in-state garbage issue.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Johnson. The order of speakers now is Senator Schmit, Senator Dierks, and Senator Morrissey. Senator Schmit is not here so, Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Madam President and members of the body, I would also rise in opposition to the IPP motion. I think that the people in my district anyway are very sincere, most of them, in wanting something out there to help them...guidelines to help them get through this period, and I think that the bill does address those particular problems for us. So there is...I think there is every reason for us to have this legislation out here, and I am sure there will be people in my district that don't like it, but I think the majority of them do, those people who are far-sighted enough to see the necessity of this type of legislation. So I am not supporting the kill motion and I hope that we can keep this bill viable and I think it will help our citizens. Thank you.
