PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Seeing no one else wishing to speak on the issue, do you have closing, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I really, Madam President, don't have much of a closing. I think it has been explained in great detail. I just want to reiterate once again that we are not amending the compact, that this has absolutely no affect on the deal that has been put with other states or that we are attempting to make, and is merely a perfunctory amendment in nature describing how it is or when it is, rather, that we are going to appoint the nonvoting member. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Beutler. We will now proceed to vote on adoption of the Beutler amendment to LB 837. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Madam President.
