

Court, it could be, we cannot direct what the courts are going to do and all of us know that. That is just another disguise in the building, and I think that the students, disguise of the bill, the students need to know that, hey, the consequences are tough and this could go in as an advanced case, which is simply one is scheduled for argument as soon as its issued, and ahead of other nonadvanced cases, and this is not strictly followed. And criminal cases, and the courts assign one day out of five scheduled for arguments to hear 10 criminal cases, and so on. I won't go down through the whole court procedure but the noncriminal advanced cases usually are five or six in number each month, and this would be maybe treated that way. The appellate has about 30 days from the final order of the district court to file an order, the parties then appeal for 50 days, and then this could be extended another 30 days. Briefs of the parties and the appellees brief then is filed, and so on and so forth. By that time, I will tell you, the child would probably be a year old, and, of course, that is one of the reasons. So I think education is very important. When I add up all of this time and the time frame that is absolute minimum is about nine months. So when you tell them, and when the students, you must tell them the court bypass procedure simply will not work. And if they like to face a judge, and maybe they will think twice before they have sexual intercourse outside of marriage, and maybe it would help to educate them. And that has always been a problem of mine, no, we don't want to educate the kids. We don't want to tell them anything. They might find out what is available or what isn't available, don't you tell my kids what I want them to know. And I very much appreciate this amendment. I think it makes the bill a better bill.

When we talk about sex education and so on, one of the things I say often, and I will say it again, is that since the sixties, in particular, we have become very open about everything.
