SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members, I would urge you, for reasons that have been discussed over and over, to advance LB 409. I really think we need to readdress this situation as we move on year after year to see exactly what's available for those folks and what we can and cannot do and what the feds are telling us we must do. Whether it's realistic within the confines of Nebraska or not, they tell us and we have to do it. The concern many have showed for the small dealer is well placed. I don't call them small marketers. I don't consider them a marketer. They're a small, little gas station operator but it is well placed. What we're also...we also are looking at the potential to run them out of business for other reasons. They will have to upgrade their facilities. They will have to upgrade their facilities in the future if they want to stay in business. That will cost them from 15 to \$25,000. That could close them right there and we haven't even discussed that. We haven't even discussed how we will keep a viable distribution system operating when it comes to that aspect of this problem.
