SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Horgan, are you asking unanimous consent to bracket that till then?

SENATOR HORGAN: Yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there objection? Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: I would just momentarily object in that before I know about this I need to ask the Speaker, does this mean, is this interpreted as meaning the same thing as a special order on the 23rd in your interpretation, or does it mean it is not eligible to be placed on the agenda until the 23rd and then if we happen to be doing General File that day, it will come up? If we happen to be doing something else, it may not.

SPEAKER BAACK: My interpretation, Senator Withem, is it can't be considered before the 23rd, but it kind of is in my hands at that point.

SENATOR WITHEM: On the 23rd it's in your hands as to how...this is not a special, it was not a unanimous consent to special order a bill?

SPEAKER BAACK: I am taking it as not the unanimous consent to special order. I am taking it as a unanimous consent to bracket it until that point but after that point it will be up to, as I will do the agenda from that point as to when it will be considered.

SENATOR WITHEM: In that case, I would withdraw any objection.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any other objection? So ordered. We will go to the next bill, LB 503.

CLERK: Mr. President, 503 was a bill introduced by Senator Moore. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22, referred to Health and Human Services for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Health and Human Services Committee.
