I had legitimate concerns for not...legitimate reasons for not voting for it, but when we are putting a hit on a lady like this, we're really doing something that's wrong and I think we need to try and address it if at all possible because if we don't address it this year yet, she may be out of luck next year and that's what I want to try and get clarified with the department and, if it can be clarified, I will have to make the effort to return the bill again...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: ...to look at it. And I hope that wouldn't be necessary. So I'll go talk to the department and express my concerns and see what kind of answers I can get. Thank you.
