SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. You have heard the closing on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 714. We will now proceed to vote on that motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I suppose to save time I just as well ask for a call of the house, please, and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under all. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence, the house is under call. Senator Schrock, would you please record your presence. Senator Labedz. Senator Warner, would you please record your presence. We are looking for Senators Chambers, Pirsch and Lynch. We are looking for Senator Chambers, Pirsch, and Lynch. Senator Wehrbein said we may proceed with the vote. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1693 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The motion fails. Next item on the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend...

SPEAKER BAACK: The call is raised.

CLERK: ...by striking Section 7 of the bill.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, this is a reinstatement of my previous motion to take the funding out of the bill. It merely takes out the \$100,000 for 10 years, which is in the bill, total of a million dollars. This takes that funding out of the bill. It has been discussed previously so I will not take a lot of time. I think it is appropriate that we take the funding out of it, particularly in view of our tight financial situation. I would ask that the amendment be adopted.
