

negotiate. Help the people out, help the only ones protecting the rest of the population in this process and adopt my amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. We will now vote on the Morrissey amendment to LB 827. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Morrissey. A roll call vote has been requested. Senator Dierks. I'm sorry. Okay. Roll call vote has been requested in reverse order. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1881 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. Before I raise the call, I would like to make an announcement. Former Senator Orval Keyes passed away this morning, and services will be held Thursday afternoon at 2:00 p.m. at the Springfield Methodist Church. And we extend our condolences to the family. I will now raise the call. Mr. Clerk, do you have anything further on the desk?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Morrissey would move to amend. Senator, I have AM1326 in front of me. (Morrissey amendment, AM1326, appears on page 1881 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you. I guess, folks, I forgot to give you my key provision in my closing, those of you who might have missed it. I was going to sit down and shut up, if we adopted that amendment, because it put it back to the basics. Now anyone who wants to reconsider, fire right up there. Seriously, I told you there's basic things that need to be done. That's what I offered last time. And there are key provisions in 827, as it exists now, that are bad, they are not negotiable, in my view, and they should not be negotiable in your view. They are bad for the citizens, good for US Ecology. So I guess I'm going to have to try and remove them one at a time. Get you on vote, those of you that didn't vote or voted no, get you on record, are you for giving US Ecology a better appeal process to the Supreme Court than you give the citizens? Yes or no. Are you for lowering the volume of the facility, for US Ecology so their license is now valid, and removing the responsibility of breaking the faith of the 5 million cubic feet that was always understood? Are you willing to do that for US Ecology? Yes or no? We'll take these each separately. And it's not my intent, again, to delay this bill. These are very important issues.
