SENATOR MORRISSEY: I would ask for a call of the house and accept call in votes.

SPEAKER BAACK: We have a request for the house to go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Call in votes have been authorized. We are voting on the first portion of the Morrissey amendment. We are voting on the first half of the Morrissey amendment. Call in votes have been authorized. The house is under call.

CLERK: Senator Chizek voting yes. Senator Beyer voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: We are voting on the first half of the Morrissey amendment. Call in votes have been authorized. The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber.

CLERK: Senator Byars voting yes. Senator Hefner voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

SPEAKER BAACK: The first half...the first portion of the Morrissey amendment has been adopted. We are now on the second portion of the Morrissey amendment. Senator Rod Johnson, do you wish to discuss the second portion.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members, I would just like the body to reject the second half. It's not that I would be fundamentally opposed to what Senator Morrissey is trying to do here. It is a little unclear to most of the folks, even those great legal minds in our body here as to what this second half of the amendment does and how it works. I'm not opposed to taking a look at this between now and Select File, but I would prefer not to see it adopted at this time.
