

SENATOR HALL: From the point in time that I make...I prove positive that it is covered, then I've got three months to pay as the insurer.

SENATOR LANDIS: If we're in a dispute, and you are proved to be correct, yes, you've got three months from that time. And I do not know how to treat the disputed period. I can't tell you whether interest is running or the like. Under normal circumstances, if you have a claim that I dispute, that decision is made at the time of the determination of the court.

SENATOR HALL: And in this case I would think that obligated would encompass that understanding. And that's all...I'm trying to get something into the record so that it is not...it doesn't become a problem down the road, because I don't have any beef with the amendment at all. I rise in support of the amendment, and I appreciate Senator Landis' comments. I also rise because I don't want to speak again in support of the committee amendments. I supported the bracket motion. I did not probably support the legislation, but I think the committee amendments do bring the bill as close to I think a very good, workable plan as possible,...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...if you believe in this type of a system. I, like Senator Schmit, am frankly rather tired of having the locals come in, and this is the second issue we've dealt with that they've gone about dealing with, the first being the use of tax money for economic development purposes, come to the Legislature, urging us to pass these types of proposals, because they have been doing it already. That is not the way I think to enact good public policy. I agree that this issue ought to be looked at, as should others. And I would hope that this is the last issue that comes before the body like this. Thank you very much. I do urge adoption of this amendment and the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Morrissey. Okay. Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: Call the question.
