CLERK: 10 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: The amendment is not adopted. Next item on the bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Hartnett. Senator, AM1868. (See page 2178 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I passed the amendment out to you today and what it deals...it's on page 2 in paragraph 3, Section 3, and it refers to "cities or villages which have a zoning jurisdiction over all or a part of the protected stream corridor shall", then it strikes "to the extent possible", enforce the use restrictions specified in the resolution. It simply makes it the cities shall do this and I think it's a rather, maybe a clarifying, technical amendment so I would simply ask it be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: Discussion on the Hartnett amendment, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Speaker and members, I have no opposition to the amendment by Senator Hartnett. It really does not change the situation. It does not change my adamant opposition to Senator Conway's amendment, but it is a clarifying amendment that is not objectionable to me.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any other discussion on the Hartnett amendment? Seeing none, Senator Hartnett do...

SENATOR HARTNETT: I would simply waive closing, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: I think we're prepared to vote on the amendment. We will now proceed to vote on the amendment to the, amendment by Senator Hartnett to the Conway amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Hartnett's amendment.
